DATES FOR 2024 Junior Livestock Auction Committee

Auction Participants <u>must</u> be enrolled in 4-H or FFA by their enrollment deadlines before you can participate in the Junior Livestock Auction at fair. In order to be a member of FFA you need to be enrolled in an AG class in the Tillamook or Nestucca School District. For more information, please contact Tillamook High School at 503-842-2566. Required Weigh-ins:

(all weigh-ins are at the Tillamook County Fairgrounds BOTH member and animal need to attend)

Beef: Exhibitors are <u>required</u> to attend one of the April weigh-ins and <u>may</u> attend the June & July weigh-ins:

EXHIBITORS MUST ATTEND ONE OF THE REQUIRED WEIGH-IN DATES

• April 6th, 2024 (required)* 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm OR

• April 10th, 2024 (required)* 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm

Goats, Sheep, Swine: EXHIBITORS MUST ATTEND ONE OF THE REQUIRED WEIGH-IN DATES

• June 1st, 2024 (required)* 7:00 to 11:00 am
OR

• June 5th, 2024 (required)* 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm

Rabbits & Poultry: EXHIBITORS MUST ATTEND ONE OF THE REQUIRED WEIGH-IN DATES

• July 6th, 2024 (required)* 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm OR

• July 10th, 2024 (required)* 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm

- Courtesy Weigh-Ins: will be held for members to check the progress of their project animals.
 - For beef species only:

o June 1st, 2024 7:00 am to 11:00 am

• For all species:

July 6th or July 10th 2024 6:00 to 7:30 pm

Required Fair Weigh-In:

August 6th, 2024 Large Animals – 10:00 am to 6:00 pm
 Small Animals – 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm

- Tillamook County Fair: members are required to show their animal(s) in the appropriate auction animal and showmanship classes during the fair.

RULES FOR 2024 4-H/FFA JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION PROGRAM

Junior Livestock Auction Committee (JLAC) approved: November 2023

General Rules:

- 1. Youth must reside in Tillamook County and be currently enrolled in a 4-H or FFA program.
- 2. Youth may participate in the Junior Livestock Auction through the summer of the year they graduate from high school.
- 3. All members must enter online on the Auction ShoWorks to be eligible for Auction by **March 31**st, **2024** at tillamookilac.fairwire.com
- 4. Members may enter only one species into the JLAC program.
 - a. Exception: See Breeding Project Exception
- 5. Breeding Project Exception
 - a. Definitions:
 - i. Breeding Project An animal owned by the member for the purpose of breeding and raising offspring. The Project must have produced offspring (or eggs) or be currently bred by June 1, 2024.
 - 1. Rabbits: a member must own a minimum of 2 does.
 - 2. Poultry: For the purpose of "breeding stock" all poultry will be considered as one species. A member must own a minimum of 4 birds.
 - ii. Market Project An animal owned by the member for the purpose of selling in the Auction.
 - b. To sell 2 market animals, the member must:
 - i. Submit a Breeding Stock Verification form & species specific 4-H Production Record that has been signed by the member's FFA Advisor or 4-H Extension Agent verifying that the member has an ongoing breeding project in one of the species being sold.

 The application must be submitted to the JLAC at the June weigh-in.
 - ii. Exhibit a Breeding Project in a breeding class at the fair. The animal must be one of the two species the member plans to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.
 - 1. However, the member does not have to show the dam; they may show a daughter of their Breeding Project at fair.
 - iii. This exception was created to help encourage 4-H or FFA members develop ongoing breeding projects that they own and manage. They are allowed to sell 2 animals to help cover the additional cost of raising breeding animals.
- 6. Animal Projects
 - i. Members may show up to two animals or pen of animals in the same species in the Auction Class. The highest placing animal/pen will sell in the Auction.
 - ii. Members may each weigh-in 2 animals, or up to 2 pens (6 animals total of poultry or rabbits) per species at the required weigh-ins.

- 7. Family Back-up Animals A family can exhibit an additional animal or pen in a species to be shared by siblings of that family. These animals must be entered into ShoWorks in the Family Back-up class under either family member(s). These animal(s) will go through the Auction Class and in the event, it places higher than the member's animals it will be sold in the auction. Directly following the Auction classes the Sale Entry must be completed and submitted to JLAC.
- 8. JLAC reserves the right to disqualify any participant because of inappropriate behavior and/or mistreatment of their animal from the sale. This includes a violation of the 4-H Code of Conduct or their School Districts Code of Conduct for FFA members.

9. Ownership of Animals:

a. Animals MUST be owned and in the possession of members prior to beginning weigh-in for their species and continue until the end of the Livestock Auction. JLAC is only responsible for animals that are sold through our sale.

10. Weigh-Ins:

- a. Members **MUST** be present and weigh-in their own animals at all required weigh-ins. They must have their 4-H club leader, FFA advisor, parent or guardian present at required weigh-ins. These adults must also sign the official weight forms.
- b. Exception: If a 4-H/FFA member cannot attend the weigh-in they must submit a JLAC Policy Waiver form to the Junior Livestock Auction Committee a minimum of one week prior to the weigh-in. The request must be written by the member and also be signed by the member's 4-H Leader or FFA Advisor. Family emergencies are considered acceptable excuses by the auction committee. Social and recreational excuses will not be accepted. A decision about the request will be made by the JLAC. A member must have an approved waiver to weigh-in on an alternate date.
- c. Members must submit "The Memorandum of Understanding" (signed by parents & member) at the first weigh-in.
- 11. All large animals enrolled at the beginning weigh-in will be ear-tagged. Poultry will be leg banded and rabbits will be ear tattooed. If an animal loses its ear tag/leg band or it becomes too tight, the owner should notify the JLAC president immediately. Contact the OSU Extension office (503) 842-3433 to get the current president's phone number.
- 12. When weights are questioned: Animals may be re-weighed once. The scales will be rebalanced, checked and then the animal is to be re-weighed immediately. The second weight stands.
- 13. On move-in day of the fair all animals that are to be sold in the auction must go through the required vet check and then to the scales to be weighed during the JLAC official weigh-in times as they ARRIVE at the fairgrounds. Animals must go directly from the vehicle to the scale for their official weight, they may NOT enter the barn until after animals are weighed.
- 14. The member will follow all provisions as laid out in this document to be eligible for sale in the Auction.

Judging Animals:

- 1. All sale animals MUST be shown by the project owner (if two animals are in same class, member must find another member willing to show the additional animal) in the appropriate Auction Class at fair.
- 2. Market animals receiving white ribbons will not be allowed to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 3. Participants must complete 4-H/FFA Showmanship classes for each species they exhibit.

Management of the Animal:

- 1. If any animal comes to the fair weigh-in and is uncontrollable, it will be held in the show ring for 30 minutes to calm down; at the end of this time the 4-H/FFA member will have to demonstrate to the JLAC that they can safely control their animal. If they cannot demonstrate this at the fair weigh-in they must remove the animal from the fairgrounds and cannot use it for classes or sale.
- 2. Market animals are to be exhibited in the show ring in a manner consistent with current 4-H & FFA showmanship practices.
- 3. All animals must be reared and treated in a humane manner throughout the duration of the project.
- 4. All market animals must be healthy. If an illness arises during fair, it must be reported to the 4-H or FFA staff and the JLAC. Appropriate actions must be taken. The Tillamook County Fair requires animals to be healthy to remain at the fair.
- 5. Male animals must be properly castrated prior to first weigh-in. Improperly castrated animals are disqualified.
- 6. All cattle must be properly dehorned prior to the first weigh-in.

Auction Sale:

- 1. Members must complete required paper work and submit to the Auction Committee according to dates below. Failure to do so will result in the member not being able to sell their animal(s) in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 2. All market animal exhibitors MUST complete:
 - a. The Memorandum of Understanding (signed by parents & member) due at first Weigh-In
 - b. Auction Biography Form due Tuesday 8/8/23 by 9:00 pm
 - c. Intent to Sell
 - i. The Intent to sell form designating which animal you will be entering into the auction must be submitted to the JLAC Office within an hour following market show
 - d. Beef exhibitors must submit by Tuesday 8/8/23 by 9:00 pm:
 - i. Transportation Slip
 - ii. Brand Inspection papers if the animal is branded
 - iii. "E Certificate" to document change in ownership (branded or not)
 - e. Buyer thank you(s) by Saturday 5:00 pm of the fair member to bring their own pre-stamped thank you notes

- 3. All members and their animals shall have a picture taken, for the buyer plaques and auction website following the market show.
- 4. All 4H/FFA members must cooperate with the JLAC Committee members during the weigh-ins and the sale.
- 5. Members must take their own animal through the sale ring. The JLAC must approve any exceptions.
- 6. All 4-H/FFA members must dress in appropriate show attire (FFA Official Dress) for Market Sale.
- 7. Member MUST retain responsibility of their animal's care until the fair closes on Saturday night of Fair and provide it with feed and water between 6:00 8:00 p.m. on Saturday evening.
- 8. Animals which have been previously sold through a finished market animal sale, connected with a fair or livestock show, are not eligible for our sale.
- 9. Commission and Fees:

Consignment of livestock will be to the Tillamook County Junior Livestock Auction Association. A commission will be taken from each lot of:

- a. 7% for Goats, Sheep, Swine, Rabbits, and Poultry
- b. 4% for Beef
- c. Market Association Commissions will be assessed to the member at the time of auction check distributions.
- 10. Members will be paid once funds are available. JLAC target payout date is within 45 days.
 - a. Prior to receiving payment, the seller (4-H or FFA member) is required to write a "thank you" note for the buyer(s). The note needs to be in a stamped, addressed envelope and turned in to the JLAC by Saturday of Fair at 5 pm
 - b. Any discrepancy must be brought to the attention of the JLAC within 30 days of postmarked check. Discrepancies will be discussed at our next committee meeting and a decision reached.
- 11. If an animal, or any portion of an animal, is condemned in the slaughter process (because of disease, antibiotics, improper castration, etc.) it is the seller's (4-H/FFA member) responsibility to absorb the loss. Sellers will sign a Memorandum of Understanding guaranteeing their animal is free of antibiotics or other drug residues.
- 12. The Junior Livestock Auction Committee will only be responsible for making arrangements for hauling and slaughter of animals that have been officially weighed in at the Fair Weigh-in and are transported directly following the Tillamook County Fair. Transportation and processing fees may be applied and will be posted in the JLAC Office during the Tillamook County Fair.

Decisions:

1. All decisions are at the discretion of the Junior Livestock Auction Committee and decisions are final.
